## Dear Commemorative Partners,

**Sunday, September 18** we hail the **United States Air Force** anniversary and 75 years of their dedicated service to our Nation. Happy Birthday U.S. Air Force!

**This milestone-year commemoration** kicked off in Pasadena, California, at the Tournament of Roses Parade and Rose Bowl December 31, 2021. The U.S. Air Force Chief of Staff, General Charles Q. Brown, acclaimed: "As the Air Force approaches its



75th anniversary, we have a responsibility to our nation and our international allies and partners. I am confident that our Airmen will continue to innovate, accelerate and thrive so that we can execute our mission

to Fly, Fight, and Win ... Airpower Anytime, Anywhere."



In March, on <u>National Vietnam War Veterans Day</u>, the Vice Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff led General Brown and the other Joint Chiefs, along with the Principal Deputy Director of the Defense POW/MIA Accounting Agency in a national joint-wreath laying ceremony at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C. These national leaders united with nine Vietnam War Gold Star family members—one mother,

two wives, one brother, three daughters and two sons on <u>29 March</u> to honor the service and sacrifice of their loved ones and all 58,281 patriots whose names are deeply etched in the black granite of 'The Wall.' **During Vietnam**, the contribution of the United States Air Force began as advisors in the U.S. Military Assistance Advisory Group in the 1950s and concluded with expansive bombing operations in the early 1970s.
