**Tomorrow**, **August 4**, we pay **tribute** to the 233 years of dedicated service of the **United States Coast Guard** (USCG). Happy birthday U.S. Coast Guard! During the Vietnam War, nearly 57 years ago this month, our first Coast Guardsmen perished. The USCG



cutter *Point Welcome* was patrolling near the mouth of the Cua Viet River in support of Operation MARKET TIME on August 11, 1966, when the tragic **incident** occurred. On Saturday, July 8, Chattanooga, Tennessee area resident and U.S. Army Vietnam veteran AH-1 pilot Larry Taylor received word from President Joseph R. Biden, Jr., that he will be presented our Nation's highest military honor, the Medal of Honor, for his actions on June 12, 1968, during the Vietnam War. Following the upcoming White House ceremony, Taylor will be inducted into The Pentagon's Hall of Heroes.
