We are pleased to announce that Maj. Gen. Edward (Ed) J. Chrystal, Jr., U.S. Army (at right), is our new director! Installed recently, Gen. Chrystal's robust service to our Nation features 38 years of Army National Guard service, as well as a 26-year civilian career as a Lieutenant with the New Jersey State Police. Many of you are already familiar with him, as he has served the past several months as Acting Director. Please formally welcome him in this new role! Also, we count it an honor and privilege to have been led by Maj. Gen. Peter (Pete) M. Aylward, U.S. Army (Retired) for the past three years. We thank him for his more than 38 years of distinguished service to our Nation and wish him well in retirement!



As we continue this important mission, we are proud to report that due to your efforts, 3.7 million Vietnam veterans have now been thanked and honored since 2011! This remarkable impact is the result of more than 26 thousand events being hosted or co-hosted by you, our Commemorative Partners all over the Nation. In fact, in 2023 alone, close to 250 organizations joined as new Partners, and all have collectively recognized nearly 223 thousand Vietnam veterans in 2,200 events across America and abroad!

One prime example includes the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) New Jersey Annual Convention, where

Speaking of lapel pins, in order to better unify our efforts to thank and honor our Vietnam veterans and

their families, we are **phasing out** the Deceased Vietnam Veteran's Surviving Spouse Lapel Pin, also known as the *Surviving Spouse Lapel Pin* (SSLP). The SSLP and its accompanying Certificate of Honor will no longer be available for new issuance through the Commemorative Partner Portal. Remaining inventory will be used to support ongoing Honorary Partner initiatives until stock is depleted (Honorary Partners should therefore continue their process as

normal). In its place, the *Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin* (VVLP) will be substituted for presentation to honor these spouses for their sacrifice with the very same distinguished memento that their Vietnam veteran would have received for their service.
