Medal of Honor Presentation to Vietnam veteran, retired U.S. Army Captain Larry L. Taylor.

On Tuesday, September 5, President Joseph R. Biden, Jr. presented our Nation's highest award for valor to Vietnam veteran, retired U.S. Army Captain Larry L. Taylor of Signal Mountain, Tennessee. The Medal of Honor was awarded to Taylor at The White House for his courageous and selfless actions in saving the lives of four of his comrades-in-arms on June 18, 1968. The following day, The Department of Defense inducted Taylor into the Pentagon's Hall of Heroes during a ceremony in Arlington, Virginia, with Secretary of Defense Lloyd J. Austin III proclaiming: "May we all draw inspiration from the resolve and the courage of this American hero."

Our staff was also privileged to present Taylor with a <u>Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin</u> for his service to our country during this ceremonial week in Washington, D.C.
