

**Tomorrow, we celebrate** <u>Veterans Day</u>—a national day of recognition each year to honor our veterans for their service to our country. It was originally known as "Armistice Day" during World War I in 1918, due to the Allied nations' cease-fire issued on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. In 1926, Congress officially recognized it as a legal holiday, "calling upon the officials to display the flag of the United States on all Government buildings on November 11 and inviting the people of the United States to observe the day in schools and churches, or other suitable places, with appropriate ceremonies of friendly relations with all other peoples."
