They sacrificed, as did their families, on behalf of our nation – we'll always remember those we lost, honor those who came home, and recommit to bringing home those who remain missing or unaccounted for.

Our Commander-in-Chief, President Joseph R. Biden, Jr., shared those words in his <u>National Vietnam</u> <u>War Veterans Day</u> (NVWVD) tribute, as millions of Americans across the country joined in various ways thanking and honoring our Vietnam veterans and their families for their service and sacrifice on and around

March 29! From Maine and Florida to California and Washington, to Hawaii and beyond, nearly *five hundred* events took place throughout the Nation, presenting more than *100 thousand* Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pins to these patriots. Highlights include ...

- President Biden's **post**, reaching nearly *35 million*.
- NVWVD garnered *30 thousand* mentions across all media channels, with *127 thousand* interactions through social media.
- Our National <u>Joint Wreath-Laying Ceremony</u> at the Vietnam
 Veterans Memorial (shown at right) was live-streamed with coverage
 from NBC, ABC, Stars and Stripes, and DoD's Defense Media

and individually thanked and honored during 27 thousand ceremonies and events since 2012!
